

Bill Gilroy	Bill Gilroy is a teacher in the public school system. He has worked with Ducks Unlimited, as a BC Parks interpreter, field wildlife research technician (squirrels, woodpeckers, rattlesnakes, amphibians, aquatic invertebrates), and was Education Director at the BC Wildlife Park from 1991-98. He. He is currently a member of a team working to help protect Python Lake in Pineview.

Bruce Baugh	Bruce Baugh taught philosophy at Thompson Rivers University for 28 years. He has authored two books and one translation, as well as numerous articles in scholarly journals. His main interests are rock music, blues, walking, and Continental philosophy.
Bruce Martin	Bruce Martin is a Professor of Human Enterprise and Innovation at TRU where his teaching and research focuses on entrepreneurship and innovation for social good. In 2018, Bruce and his colleagues created the Innovation for Social Good cluster, a collaboration that studies how to create, scale and sustain social enterprises especially in interior B.C. His latest research examines how social enterprises succeed, and fail, when attempting to scale up globally. He has experience creating, managing and leading non profit government and academic organizations. Bruce spent 17 years living and working in Asia and Europe.
Chelsea Gimby	Chelsea is a registered Acupuncturist with 18 years of experience. She studied Quigong as part of professional development both in Canada and China. Qigong can be practiced by anybody
Christopher Weddell	Christopher Weddell is a founding member and past Artistic Associate of Bard On The Beach. He has written several plays, including the book and lyrics for the upcoming musical version of W. O. Mitchell's Who Has Seen The Wind. Most recently, Christopher has directed Love and Information, and his own adaptation of Gary Geddes poem cycle Falsework (The Canadian College Of Performing Arts). Other directing credits include the Jessie nominated Richard II (Bard On The Beach), and Waiting For Godot at Kaspar Theater, Prague. Last spring he directed George Johnson's Boomerangst (Chimera Theatre) & Sea Wall (Mad Fox), A veteran acting mentor, Christopher has taught acting and Shakespeare workshops in Prague, Lennox, Massachusetts and all across Canada. He is a past recipient of the Edmund Kean Sword Award from Bard On The Beach. Last year, he was presented with an honorary Doctor Of Letters from Thompson Rivers University. He has played "Little Lear" (Gloucester) three times.

He maintained an active research program and authored or coauthored 74 refereed papers, two reviews and three book chapters, and presented papers at international conferences. He has taught courses, mainly Organic Chemistry, at all university levels and received the Stanton Teaching Award from the University of Manitoba in 1995. He has a continuing interest in scientific education and a wide range of hobbies, including travel, playing the clarinet, woodworking and genealogy.

Eden McKay	Eden is the Food Sovereighty Coordinator at the Kamloops Food Policy Council, where she is responsible for leading the groundwork to foster interconnectivity between the KFPC's diverse food sovereignty programs. Eden is a horticulurist whose work focuses on food security and urban ecological health. She facilitates the Community Seed Library.
Elliot Andrew	Elliot is the Farm Coordinator for our Butler Urban Farm. He takes care of plants and farm maintennce and introduces visitors and volunteers to the space. He in his final year of Natural Resource Science at TRU and is passionate about gardening, community building, cooperatives, foraging, and native plants and ecosystems. Elliot is excited to provide free produce for our community through BUF. He is also attempting to document all of the different insect/arthropod species observed at the farm.

She is a passionate advocate for green burial and alternative sustainable death care options. In 2020 she founded Death Care BC to support the needs of health care providers and the bereaved.
